


HELP GROUP MUSIC FESTIVAL 2026

COLLECTION OF 2025/20206 CAR STICKERS

For security reasons, CHIS car stickers are renewed each year. Please ensure your sticker is displayed on the windshield, as vehicles without updated stickers will not be allowed into the school grounds.

Each family receives up to two free stickers, with additional stickers available at RM5 each. Parents who have not yet collected their 2025/2026 stickers can do so at the Admin Reception Counter.

You may also register your vehicle number in advance by filling the vehicle registration form <u>here</u>. Once submitted, stickers will be prepared for you to collect directly.

Please note: Vehicles without updated car stickers will not be permitted entry into the school campus.

STUDENT ITEM DROP OFF

To support student responsibility for their belongings and to enable parents to drop off items for their child, there are now some shelves by the security desk in the lobby. The shelves are for items their child has arranged to receive.

Please note:

- Items should only be put there if the **student is aware** of the drop-off and has made a request through the school office.
- Students are **strictly not permitted** to use mobile phones, iPads, etc to request deliveries without the school's knowledge.

It is the student's responsibility to collect items once they have been dropped off. We greatly appreciate parent cooperation in reinforcing responsibility and good communication.



EXIT PASS - FOR EARLY DISMISSAL DUE TO ILLNESSES

To strengthen our safeguarding measures, we have updated our exit pass procedures for students who wish to leave early due to illnesses:

- Students who wish to leave early due to any illness must present a nurse's pass.
- If a nurse's pass is not provided, the student must obtain <u>approval</u> from their class tutors/ Head of Year or Key Stage Coordinator before an exit pass is issued.
- School reception will verify approval before allowing any student to leave.
- Students are <u>strictly not permitted</u> to use mobile phones, iPads, etc. to contact their parents directly without the school's knowledge.

These measures are in place to ensure the safety and well-being of all students. We appreciate your cooperation in reinforcing these procedures.
